# **Electricity Demand in February 2010 (Bulletin)**

#### **Demand Overview (Total Sales of 10 Power Companies)**

- Electricity demand in February 2010, measured in terms of the total electricity sales of the 10 power companies, was up 5.5% from the last year to 76.7 billion kWh.
- Outside the liberalized segment, lighting demand rose by 1.4% due principally to increased heating demand caused by relatively lower temperatures from early to mid February, compared with a year ago, in spite of a shorter meter-reading period than the last year.

Commercial demand in the liberalized segment increased by 0.6%.
