### **Electricity Demand in May 2010 (Confirmed Report)**

### **Demand Overview (Total Sales of 10 Power Companies)**

- Electricity demand in May, measured in terms of the total electricity sales of the 10 power companies, was up 6.7% on last year to 68.9 billion kWh.
- Outside the liberalized segment, lighting demand rose by 6.5% year on year due principally to increased heating demand caused by relatively lower temperatures from mid to late April, compared with a year ago.

Commercial demand in the liberalized segment increased by 0.1%.

Large Industrial Demand (up 12.4% on the year, 22.46 billion kWh in total)

Large industrial user demand was up year on year for six consecutive months, increasing by 12.4%. This was due mainly to the year-on-year increase in all major sectors including steel.
