Electricity Demand in September 2010 (Confirmed Report)

Demand Overview (Total Sales of 10 Power Companies)

- Electricity demand in September, measured in terms of the total electricity sales of the 10 power companies, was up 16.2% on last year to 85.7 billion kWh.
- Outside the liberalized segment, lighting demand rose by 26.9% year on year due principally to increased cooling demand caused by record high temperatures in this summer.

Commercial demand in the liberalized segment increased by 10.4%.

Large Industrial Demand (up 10.4% on the year, 24.88 billion kWh in total)

Large industrial user demand was up year on year for ten consecutive months, increasing by 10.4%. This was due mainly to the year-on-year increase in all major sectors including steel.
