Electricity Demand in First Half of Fiscal 2013 (Bulletin)

Demand Overview (Total Sales of 10 Power Companies)

- Electricity demand in the first half of fiscal 2013, measured in terms of the total electricity sales of the 10 power companies, declined by 1.0% from last year to 418.2 billion kWh.
- Outside the liberalized segment, lighting demand dropped by 1.0% due principally to decreased heating demands caused by relatively higher temperatures from March to early April than last year, in spite of increased cooling demands caused by relatively higher temperatures from June to August than last year.

Commercial demand in the liberalized segment declined by 0.3% due mainly to decreased heating demands caused by relatively higher temperatures in early April than last year, in spite of increased cooling demands caused by relatively higher temperatures from June to August than last year.
